

ACT Prop Course

The ACT is a 3 hour (3.5 hours with the Writing section added) exam that high school students take for college admissions. There are four sections: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science. The ACT Plus Writing exam includes an additional Writing section, which some colleges require. A 36 is a perfect ACT score.

About: The ACT Test is used for college admissions. It is among the most important test students take in high school.

Governing Body: The ACT is created by the ACT, Inc. (Originally known as the American College Testing Program)

Official Website: www.actstudent.org

Test Length: 3 hours (3.5 hours with the Writing section added)

Test Subjects & Format: The exam covers four subject areas: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science. The ACT Plus Writing exam includes an additional Writing section. The exam can be taken digitally or on paper, per the student's preference. The digital and paper formats are identical.

Subject	Format	What It Includes
English	45 Multiple Choice Questions	Identifying errors in passages and improving grammar, usage, and syntax
Math	60 Multiple Choice Questions	Questions on arithmetic operations, algebra, geometry, statistics and probability
Reading	40 Multiple Choice Questions	Reading passages evaluating comprehension skills
Science	49 Multiple Choice Questions	Questions testing interpretation, analysis, evaluation, reasoning, and problem-solving skills required in the natural sciences
Writing (Optional)	1 Essay	An essay (based on a logical argument) measuring writing and composition skills

Grading: Each section is graded on a scale of 1-36. The scores from each section are averaged to create a combined Composite Score with 36 being the highest score possible. If you take the optional Writing Test, your score report will show an additional Writing subscore on a scale of 1-12.

Test Dates: The ACT is offered nationally on seven dates: in September, October, December, February, April, June and July. The specific test dates vary by year.

Registration: Register for the official ACT at www.actstudent.org. It is best to sign at least 2 months ahead of time to get your preferred test center and avoid late fees.

Test Locations: Students select a test center (usually a local high school) during registration.

Test Fees: The exam fees are \$80 (ACT with Writing) or \$60 (ACT without Writing). There is an additional \$35 fee for late registration. (Pricing may vary from year to year. Check with the ACT website for the most up-to-date test fee.)

FAQs

Should I take the ACT with or without writing? Very few colleges now require the ACT Plus Writing exam. Please check early to make sure you take the right version! Additionally, if you feel you are a good writer and want to showcase your ability, it can be helpful to take the Writing Test.

How much high school math do I need before I start preparing for the ACT? The ACT Math section contains 60 questions covering six content areas: pre-algebra, elementary algebra, intermediate algebra, coordinate geometry, plane geometry and trigonometry.

What is a good score? A good score on the ACT is one that will get you into the college of your choice, so score goals should be based on which college you want to attend. The average score on the ACT is a 21. Here are the *average* scores of incoming freshman for various schools:

FAQs CONTINUED

Does it matter if I take the ACT or the SAT? Both the ACT and the SAT are nationally administered standardized tests that help colleges evaluate candidates. Most colleges and universities accept both. We recommend that students take both exams and use the higher score. Some students do better on one than the other; however, one is not necessarily easier than the other.

When should I start preparing for the ACT? It's always best to start preparing as early as possible so that you have more preparation time to reach your goals. We recommend starting the summer before 11th grade, but students should start preparing no later than the summer before 12th grade.

How many times can I take the ACT? You may take the ACT as often as you like. A separate score record is kept for each administration of the exam. Only the score record from the test date requested will be sent to a college. You can request for more than one test date report to be sent to a college.

What other factors besides ACT scores affect college admissions? Entrance exams are a large part of admissions decisions, but other factors contribute to your appeal. Class rank, extracurricular activities, major, recommendations, essays, and the interview can influence admissions departments.

ACT vs. SAT

Understanding the difference between the 2 main college admissions tests (the ACT and the SAT) is important. Students must decide whether they want to take the ACT, SAT, or both.
