About: The GMAT is a 4-hour computerized exam required for admission to graduate business schools. The maximum score on the GMAT, which is a combination of the Quantitative and Verbal sections, is 800.

The GMAT is taken on a computer, as it is a CAT (Computer-Adaptive Test). During CAT tests, the level of difficulty on each question is determined by the responses to all previous questions.

Grading: The Quantitative and Verbal sections are graded on a scale of 200-800. The Writing section essay receives a score of 0-6. The Integrated Reasoning section receives a score of 1-8. The Quantitative and Verbal sections are averaged to get a combined score out of 800. The Writing section and Integrated Reasoning section are not factored into the overall score.

Test Dates & Locations: Because the GMAT is a computerized test, the GMAT is given year-round in test centers around the country. To schedule a specific session visit www.mba.com.

Registration: Registration for the official GMAT can be done at www.mba.com. It is wise to sign up 6-8 weeks ahead of time to get your preferred test center and time.

Test Fees: \$250 (registration fee), +\$50 (rescheduling fee)

Cancellations/Refunds: \$80 will be refunded if a test is cancelled at least seven calendar days before your scheduled appointment.

Score Goals

What is a good score on the GMAT? A good score on the GMAT is a score that will get you into your first choice for business school. This varies with the schools you are applying to, what type of program you are trying to join (full time, part time, or executive education), your work experience, and your undergraduate GPA.

FAQs

How does the CAT (Computer Adaptive Test) work? The computer-adaptive format presents questions according to each individual's ability level. These questions are chosen from a pool of test questions categorized by content and difficulty. The first question is of medium difficulty. Every subsequent question is then determined by your responses to all previous questions. You are not allowed to change answers to previous questions as you proceed through the test, and you are not allowed to skip questions. A key part in preparing for the GMAT is to understand the CAT format and how your score is determined.

When should I take the GMAT?

The GMAT is given year-round in testing centers all across the country. The only restriction on taking the test is that you may not take the GMAT more than one time in any calendar month, even if you have taken the test and canceled your scores. When you should take the GMAT depends on the application deadline of the school to which you are applying and if you think you may need to take it more than once. Most MBA schools have up to three rounds for admission; candidates in each round are required to submit an application and in most cases, do a formal interview. Consult your prospective school's admissions office about its schedule.

How long are my GMAT scores good for? Official Score Reports include all GMAT exams you've taken within the past five years. Score Reports from tests taken from five to 10 years ago are available, but they are sent to schools with the caveat that they should be interpreted with caution. Check with the school before requesting an old score report, because many do not accept them. Scores over a decade old are not available. If you have a score within five years, only scores from the last five years will be reported.

When do I get my scores? You will get an unofficial score report with Verbal, Quantitative, and Total scores immediately after the test. Official Score Reports are available online within 20 days to you and to the programs you requested receive them.

What if I take the GMAT and do poorly? The only chance you have to cancel your score is immediately after you finish the exam but before you see your scores. After they have been reported to you, they cannot be canceled. If you cancel your scores, they cannot be reinstated, you will not be eligible for a refund, the score cancellation will be in your permanent record and will be reported on all future reports, and you must wait 31 days before taking the exam again.

How many times can I take the GMAT? You may take the GMAT no more than once in any calendar month and no more than five times within a 12-month period. To take the GMAT more than five times a written request must be submitted to GMAC. You may take the test beyond five times only after permission is granted. GMAT scores are valid for five years after you take the test.

Where can I go to find information about business school rankings? For information on business school rankings please visit www.usnews.com or visit www.businessweek.com.

How important is the GMAT for admissions? Admission officers generally look at your application, transcript, prior work experience, and GMAT score. While having a very high score on the GMAT will not necessarily get you into your school of choice, a low score will keep you from being accepted to many schools. The GMAT is the only required test for MBA admissions, but schools weight its importance differently. The most competitive MBA schools look for very high GMAT scores for admission.
